JC Bravo – great wine, especially whites

Finca La Carrodilla – small, gorgeous succulent garden, really good wines. Near #25 on the map.

Vinos Lafarga – visible from the campground, stone winery, great view of the Valle from the East

Vinedos Malagon – good wine

La Case de Dona Lupe – great wine and restaurant

Cieli – great wine and beer

Media Perra - beer

La Esperanza – great place for a late lunch, closes early
